

# SOLDIERS OF KILLIECRANKIE

## TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Please note the Soldiers of Killiecrankie is a non-political organisation – your entry to the event, signifies your agreement to the following:-

- **You are aware that** Battles are dangerous and noisy.
- **Once paid to enter** no refunds given after purchase.
- **You agree to NOT associate Soldiers of Killiecrankie in anyway with any political party** or events in any shape or form. No flags, banners or any other political paraphernalia are allowed at the event.
- **This is an outdoor, green field event, it is your responsibility to be** prepared for all weather conditions and bring appropriate clothing and footwear.
- **Children under 14 years of age must be accompanied by an adult** (a maximum of 6 children to each adult).
- **Wheelchair access is available, however access may be restricted or difficult to negotiate.** Each disabled person and their supporters must assess how suitable this out door event is to their abilities (access, mobility, firearm bangs etc). Space for disabled viewing cannot be reserved in advance.
- **You use the car park at your own risk and enter the event at your own risk,** the event committee will not be held liable by you for any loss, injury or damage sustained within any area.
- **No alcoholic drinks, glass or cans may be brought in to the event.**
- **Plastic bottles containing liquids over 500ml are not permitted** to be brought into the event.
- **The event bars will operate to 'Challenge 25' legislation,** and proof of age may be required to purchase alcohol or replica weaponry.
- **Smoking is strictly prohibited in enclosed areas.** Please be respectful of others.
- **The event organisers reserve the right to refuse admission to** anyone they feel is unsuitable for the event or may cause problems in anyway.
- **Personal grills, stoves and barbeques are not permitted** in to the event.
- **Dog owners MUST ensure dogs are on leads at all times, and no animal should be** brought to the event that would be susceptible to bangs from fire arms.
- **All ticket holders consent to filming, photography and sound recordings as** members of the public, which will be used for promotional of the event.
- **No commercial photograph, sound recording or filming of any type** without prior written permission.
- **No Drones or other aerial devices allowed to be flown over the event,** unless specific authorisation is obtained in writing from the event committee prior to the event.
- **You MUST observe safety signage and directions from stewards at all times.**
- **In the event of an emergency you may need to** evacuate part or all areas. Please follow directions to the safest exit. At all times follow the instructions of stewards or police.
- **Bags may be searched on entry for security reasons.**
- **The Event Organisers reserve the right to make alterations to the event** or advertised program as necessary.
- **The Sgian Dubh is allowed at the event but only when worn as part of traditional Scottish Highland Dress.** Anyone bringing a Sgian Dubh agrees that it will remain in its scabbard at all times. Anyone unsheathing their Sgian Dubh is liable to have it confiscated by the stewards or the Police and risks being ejected from the event, without recourse to any refunds. **Any offences relating to misuse of the Sgian Dubh ceremonial dagger may be classed as an offence under the Criminal Justice Act and the Offensive Weapon Act and noncompliance may lead to arrest and/or prosecution.**
